The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Private Investigators and Security Guards Amendment Act 2003.
- (2) In this Act, the Private Investigators and Security Guards Act 1974 is called “the principal Act”.

This Act is administered in the Ministry of Justice.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

3 Grounds for cancellation of licence

Section 58(1)(b) of the principal Act is amended by omitting the words “Part 3 of the Dogs Registration Act 1955”, and substituting the words “the Dog Control Act 1996”.
