Plant Variety Rights (Fees) Amendment Order 2001: revoked, on 24 January 2023, pursuant to section 158(2)(c) of the Plant Variety Rights Act 2022 (2022 No 61).

Pursuant to section 38 of the Plant Variety Rights Act 1987, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following order.

1 Title

- (1) This order is the Plant Variety Rights (Fees) Amendment Order 2001.
- (2) In this order, the Plant Variety Rights (Fees) Order 1999¹ is called “the principal order”.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 1 January 2002.

The principal order is amended by revoking the Schedule, and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule of this order.
