Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 October 2004, adds—

- the Quota Management Area GLM9 for green-lipped mussel to Schedule 3 of the Fisheries Act 1996 (which lists stocks that are managed with an alternative total allowable catch):
- green-lipped mussel in Quota Management Area GLM9 to Schedule 6 of the Fisheries Act 1996 (which lists stocks that may be returned to the sea or other waters in accordance with stated requirements).
