1 Title

This order is the Major Events Management (Olympic Games and Commonwealth Games Emblems and Words) Order 2019.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 1 October 2019.

3 Schedule of Major Events Management Act 2007 amended

In the Major Events Management Act 2007, Schedule,—

- (a) Part 1, replace the item relating to the five ring Olympic symbol with a fern leaf (wording and emblem) with the items set out in Part 1 of the Schedule of this order:
- (b) Part 2, clause 1, insert in their appropriate alphabetical order the items set out in Part 2 of the Schedule of this order:
- (c) replace Part 3 with the Part 3 set out in Part 3 of the Schedule of this order.



Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 October 2019, is made under the Major Events Management Act 2007 (the **Act**). It amends the Act’s Schedule, which con-

tains permanently protected emblems and words. Use of those emblems and words that is not authorised or covered by an exception or a defence is, under sections 28 to 32 of the Act, an offence for which the maximum penalty is a fine of \$150,000. The Act also contains (in section 34) related prohibitions and authorising provisions for registration of bodies under names, or of emblems, the use of which would be an offence under section 28.

The amendments—

- replace an emblem with updated emblems for the Olympic Games:
- add various names to clause 1 of Part 2:
- replace and update Part 3.

- 2020 Winter Youth Olympic Games in Lausanne in Switzerland:
- 2022 Summer Youth Olympic Games in Dakar in Senegal:
- 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham in the United Kingdom:
- 2022 Winter Olympic Games in Beijing in the People’s Republic of China:
- 2024 Summer Olympic Games in Paris in France:
- 2028 Summer Olympic Games in Los Angeles in the United States of America.
